- Turn right onto Rockingham Drive
- Take the 1st left onto Old Placerville Road
- Take the 1st left onto Schriever Avenue

### From I-80 West (Reno)

- Follow I-80 to I-80 BUS W/US-50
- Continue onto US-50 W
- Take exit 15 for Mather Field Road toward Rancho Cordova
- Turn left onto Mather Field Road
- Turn right onto Rockingham Drive
- Take the 1st left onto Old Placerville Road
- Take the 1st left onto Schriever Avenue

### From the Sacramento International Airport

- Turn onto US-50 E toward I-80/I-5/San Francisco/CA-99/Redding/Placerville/S Lake Tahoe
- Turn right onto Mather Field Road
- Turn right onto Rockingham Drive
- Take the 1st left onto Old Placerville Road
