This document lists required area plan elements as referenced in Health and Safety Code Section (HSC) Section 25500 et al. and California Code of Regulations (CCR) Title 19. This checklist is intended as guidance to assist with verifying those elements are present within an area plan.

19 CCR Section 5020.5(a)(1); 19 CCR Section 5020.1(c)	Area plans must establish provisions for training of emergency response personnel in emergency procedures for first response to a release or threatened release of hazardous materials, to include pesticide drift exposure incidents.	
19 CCR Section 5020.5(a)(2)	Area plans must establish provisions for training of emergency response personnel in health and safety procedures for response personnel.	
19 CCR Section 5020.5(a)(3)	Area plans must establish provisions for training of emergency response personnel in use of emergency response equipment and supplies.	
19 CCR Section 5020.5(a)(4)	Area plans must establish provisions for training of emergency response personnel in procedures for access to mutual-aid resources.

19 CCR Section 5020.6(c); 19 CCR Section 5020.1(c)	Procedures, developed in consultation with the County Agricultural Commissioner, to notify residents of a pesticide drift exposure incident and a procedure to assist in the coordination of an evacuation, if deemed necessary by emergency response personnel.	
19 CCR Section 5020.6(d)	Procedures to identify all languages known to be spoken in the administering agency's county or city, as the case may be, and ensure that any individual is able to access services in their native language as required by Section 11135 of the Government Code. The area plan will outline what these services are and how they will be provided in the languages identified.	
19 CCR Section 5020.6(e)	Designation of responsibility for the coordinated release of safety information to the public and to the local Emergency Broadcast System.	
19 CCR Section 5020.6(f)	Provisions for informing medical and health facilities of the nature of the incident and the substance(s) involved in an incident.	
19 CCR Section 5020.6(g)(1)	Provisions for evacuation plans that provide for determination of the necessity for evacuation.	
19 CCR Section 5020.6(g)(2)	Provisions for evacuation plans that provide for centralized coordination of information with local law, fire, public health, medical, and other emergency response agencies.	
19 CCR Section 5020.6(g)(3)	Provisions for evacuation plans that provide for timely notification of the affected public, including release of messages prepared pursuant to (e) designation of responsibility for the coordinated release of safety information to the public and to the local Emergency Broadcast System, and (f) provisions for informing medical and health facilities of the nature of the incident and the substance(s) involved in an incident.	
19 CCR Section 5020.6(g)(4)	Provisions for evacuation plans that provide for properties of hazardous materials, such as quantity, concentration, vapor pressure, density, and potential health effects.	
19 CCR Section 5020.6(g)(5)	Provisions for evacuation plans that provide for possible release scenarios.	
19 CCR Section 5020.6(g)(6)	Provisions for evacuation plans that provide for facility characteristics, topography, meteorology, and demography of potentially affected areas.	

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19 CCR Section 5020.6(g)(7)	Provisions for evacuation plans that provide for ingress and egress routes and alternatives.	
19 CCR Section 5020.6(g)(8)	Provisions for evacuation plans that provide for location of medical resources trained and equipped for hazardous material response.	
19 CCR Section 5020.6(g)(9)	Provisions for evacuation plans that provide for mass-care facilities, reception areas, and sheltering.	
19 CCR Section 5020.6(g)(10)	Provisions for evacuation plans that provide for procedures for post-emergency period population recovery.	
HSC Section 25503(c)(6); 19 CCR Section 5020.7	Supplies and Equipment	
19 CCR Section 5020.7(a)	Area plans shall contain a listing and description of available emergency response supplies and equipment specifically designated for the potential emergencies presented by the hazardous materials which are handled within the jurisdiction of the administering agency. This information shall be presented to reflect response capability.	
19 CCR Section 5020.7(b)	Area plans shall outline the provisions for regular testing, if applicable, and proper maintenance of emergency response equipment under the direct control of the county or city, as the case may be.	
HSC Section 25503(c)(8); 19 CCR Section 5020.8	Incident Critique and Follow-Up	
19 CCR Section 5020.8	Area plans shall describe provisions for the critique and follow-up of major incidents of a release or threatened release of hazardous material, including pesticide drift exposure incidents.	
19 CCR Section 5020.8	The critique shall include an interagency meeting to evaluate the response, to improve future response, and to determine if any area plan revisions are required.
