Annual Single Fee Summary: Instructions

At the end of every fiscal year, in accordance with California Code of Regulations, Title 27, §15290(b), each Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA) shall submit to the Secretary of the California Environmental Protection Agency (CalEPA) an annual summary of all single fee and surcharge amounts billed, waived, collected, remitted and still owed, relative to each program element surcharge component for the previous fiscal year.

If the CUPA believes that the number of regulated businesses will change significantly for any program element in the current fiscal year or in the next fiscal year, a cover letter addressing the estimated changes for each program element shall be submitted with the Annual Single Fee Summary, per California Code of Regulations, Title 27, §15290(b)(2).

CUPAs are required to submit the Annual Single Fee Summary report by September 30, following the end of each fiscal year, to CalEPA via:

The following are instructions to complete to the form:

CUPA:	Enter the Certified Unified Program Agency submitting the Annual Single Fee Summary to CalEPA.	
Fiscal Year:	Enter the fiscal year for which the Annual Single Fee Summary is submitted. The Annual Single Fee Summary should only capture information for the previous fiscal year (July 1 st – June 30 th).	
Date Created:	Enter the date the Annual Single Fee Summary is being prepared and/or submitted to CalEPA.	
Completed By:	Enter the name of the CUPA representative completing the Annual Single Fee Summary.	
Telephone Number:	Enter the telephone number of the CUPA representative completing the Annual Single Fee Summary.	
Single Fee:	Report the total amount of the single fee billed, waived, and collected from all regulated businesses. The single fee includes the CUPA's fees for necessary and reasonable costs to implement the Unified Program.	
	For Annual Single Fee Summary reporting purposes, state surcharge amounts should not be included in the single fee amounts. State surcharge amounts will be reported in a different section of the Annual Single Fee Summary.

Participating Agencies:	Report the total amount of the single fee billed and collected on behalf of the Participating Agencies. Report the total amount of the single fee remitted to and still owed to Participating Agencies, if any. The single fee for Participating Agencies includes the Participating Agency's fees for necessary and reasonable costs to implement one or more elements of the Unified Program. If a CUPA does not have any applicable single fee amounts to report regarding Participating Agencies, each field should be completed with "N/A." Title 27, §15210				
Surcharges*:	Report the total amount of each surcharge billed, waived, and collected. Report the total amount of each surcharge remitted to and still owed to the State (CalEPA). The amount remitted to CalEPA for each program element surcharge on the Annual Single Fee Summary Report should equal the sum of all quarterly Surcharge Transmittal Reports for the same program element for the previous fiscal year.
