CERS NextGen Business Process Analysis Project

CalEPA is continuing with the efforts of the California Environmental Reporting System (CERS) NextGen business process analysis project, which has completed documenting the current CERS system, its issues (called pain points), and several hundred proposed enhancements.

CalEPA will be reaching out to identified stakeholders for a series of user feedback sessions in November, 2019, to validate the enhancement recommendations and to help determine the future functions and capabilities of CERS and CERS NextGen.

Adoption of the Proposed UST Regulations for the Storage of Diesel Containing up to 20 Percent Biodiesel

The proposed underground storage tank (UST) regulations for the storage of diesel containing up to 20 percent biodiesel (B20) were adopted at the August 6, 2019, State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) Meeting. The adopted UST

regulations amends California Code of Regulations, title 23, division 3, chapter 16, article 3, sections 2631 and 2631.2. The proposed amendment to section 2631 recognizes B20 as an equivalent to diesel stored in double-walled UST systems, unless any material or component of the UST system is determined not compatible with B20. The adopted amendments also delete section 2631.2, which provides a temporary variance for biodiesel blends from June 1, 2009, to June 1, 2012, because it is inoperative. The next step is to submit the completed rulemaking package to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) for review and approval before filing with the California Secretary of State. We will provide an effective date once we have been advised by OAL.

Site-Specific Variances

The State Water Board has recently received several inquiries regarding the applicability of site-specific variances. A site-specific variance permits the use of an alternative method of construction or monitoring at one or more sites because of special circumstances that are not generally applicable to other facilities and where there is clear and convincing evidence that the alternative method will adequately protect the soil and beneficial uses of waters of the State from an unauthorized release in accordance with Health and Safety Code, division 20, chapter 6.7, section 25299.4(b)(4). Site-specific variances should only be issued during the permitting process for an install or upgrade and not after construction commencement.

Owners and operators requesting a site-specific variance must submit to the local agency complete construction and monitoring plans with the application and associated fee for the variance. All applications are then reviewed by the Regional Water Quality Control Board. Approved applications will be returned with any additional conditions and descriptions of the alternative monitoring methods that must be included in the operating permit conditions. Additional guidance regarding site-specific variances from the State Water Board is forthcoming.

Reviewing and Revising UPA Policies and Procedures

Unified Program Agencies (UPAs) are required to have policies and procedures in place as part of their UPA certification. Occasionally, these policies and procedures will need revisions to stay current with changes to UST program requirements. Recently, there have been changes to UST program requirements such as permitting, overfill inspections, spill container testing, and regulatory forms. UPAs should revise and update their policies and procedures as necessary to ensure policies and procedures are current and consistent with UPA program implementation.

UPAs should keep apprised of all changes to UST program requirements and revise policies and procedures as necessary.
